Confidential Discussion and Guidance on Next Steps:



The Sexual Assault Resource Centre (SARC) is not part of the police, but they support a person's decision to involve the police. Information in other languages is available.

SARC is a free confidential service that involves medical care, forensic examination and counselling support to people who have experienced a recent sexual assault (rape) in the last **two weeks** and counselling for sexual assault / abuse experienced recently or in the past.
